

Help your school community show appreciation for staff

Your teachers and staff are working harder than ever to provide the best educational experience for students. It's likely your district has amazing stories to share about how your teachers and staff are serving your students, parents, families, and community. And the simple act of recognizing hard work and dedication has a significant impact on morale — especially as burnout and turnover are at all-time highs.

Here are a few ways you can engage and empower your school community.

Create a topic to capture stories.

Using Let's Talk, you can easily capture staff nominations, shout outs, or notes of encouragement through a staff appreciation topic. You can give it a special title related to your district or goals.

Customize your form message and/or thank you messages.

Take the opportunity to customize form messages and thank you messages to improve communications with your stakeholders. Not sure where to start? Here are <u>directions for form messages</u>.

Encourage your community to share their stories.

Ask your community their positive stories via Let's Talk by promoting the topic on your public communications channels, such as the carousel on your main website and on social media.

Once you create a name for your topic, work with your communications team to build website and social graphics to help promote it. If you don't have a person on staff who can help, try a free design tool like Canva.com. If you need the Let's Talk logo, you can find it in the Let's Talk Communications Toolkit.

You also might consider promoting your new topic in an upcoming newsletter, email to families, or other outbound communications channel used by the district.

You can frequently promote this new topic following seasonal themes and recognized holidays — such as Valentine's Day or Thanksgiving — or special days focused on educators, such as Teachers' Day on May 1.

Example message for social media, newsletters, or other outbound channels:

Recognize exemplary service.

Other ways to recognize your staff and teachers for their efforts:

Send thoughtful handwritten notes throughout the year — especially after a particularly busy period

Give them a shout out in a meeting, within your monthly newsletter, or on your website

Provide a small gift, such as a gift card to a local restaurant or movie tickets

Rotate a special workplace perk (like a coveted parking spot)

Post their photo to social media, tagging @K12Insight
